

Lesson Plan for United States Presidents and their Wars Timeline

Introduction: In this activity, students will learn when the major wars that the United States was part of took place and who was in charge when they occurred.

Standards:

16.A.3a Describe how historians use models for organizing historical interpretation (e.g., biographies, political events, issues and conflicts).

Objectives:

Learn when the major wars the United States was part of took place.

Learn who was president when those wars took place.

Provide the students with copies of the attached worksheets.
Have the students create a timeline from 1700 to Present, with every ten years marked. Above this timeline have them mark the beginning and end dates of the wars listed and below the timeline have them mark the beginning and end dates of the terms of the presidents listed on the worksheets. In addition, have the presidents be color-coded on the timeline by the party they were members of: Democrat in blue, Republican in Red, Democratic-Republican in purple.

At the library:

Have students research the wars and presidents in order to create the timeline.

United States Presidents and Their Wars Timeline Answers

Key: War= Beginning date to End Date+ President during

- *American Civil War= 1861 to 1865+ Abraham Lincoln
- *American Revolutionary War= 1775 to 1783+ no president yet
- *Boxer Rebellion= 1899 to 1901+ William McKinley
- *First Barbary War (also known as the Barbary Coast War or the Tripolitan War)= 1801 to 1805+ Thomas Jefferson
- *Gulf War= 1990 to 1991+ George H. W. Bush
- *Korean War= 1950 to 1953+ Harry S. Truman
- *Mexican-American War= 1846 to 1848+ James Knox Polk
- *Philippine-American War= 1899 to 1913+ William McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft
- *Second Barbary War (also known as the Algerine or Algerian War)= 1815 to 1815+ James Madison
- *Spanish-American War= 1898 to 1898+ William McKinley
- *Vietnam War= 1951 to 1975+ Harry S. Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford
- *War of 1812= 1812 to 1815+ James Madison
- *World War I= 1914 to 1918+ Woodrow Wilson
- *World War II= 1939 to 1945+ Franklin Delano Roosevelt

Key: President= Began term to End of term= Political Party

Abraham Lincoln= 1861 to 1865= Republican
Dwight D. Eisenhower= 1953 to 1961= Republican
Franklin Delano Roosevelt= 1933 to 1945= Democrat
George H. W. Bush= 1989 to 1993= Republican
Gerald Ford= 1974 to 1977= Republican
Harry S. Truman= 1945 to 1953= Democrat
James Knox Polk= 1845 to 1849= Democrat
James Madison= 1809 to 1817= Democratic-Republican
John F. Kennedy= 1961 to 1963= Democrat
Lyndon B. Johnson= 1963 to 1969= Democrat
Richard Nixon= 1969 to 1974= Republican
Theodore Roosevelt= 1901 to 1909= Republican
Thomas Jefferson= 1801 to 1809= Democratic-Republican
William Howard Taft= 1909 to 1912= Republican
William McKinley= 1897 to 1901= Republican
Woodrow Wilson= 1913 to 1921= Democrat
